Teaching Points

- ▶ About 1 in 500 men with undescended testes develop testicular cancer, which occurs in the third to fourth decades of life. This patient is 17 years of age, and the testicle should be removed as it is not viable. One of the strongest arguments for early orchiopexy is to prevent testicular cancer.
- ▶ The most common cancer is seminoma. It is treatable if diagnosed early. Therefore, urologists re orchiopexy. Young males can be taught a testicular exam, although this is not effective screen
